Dear Parents and Carers of Year 7 (who will be in Year 8 in September 2020)

The Surrey Immunisation Team have been in touch to apologise - the school URN they provided in the email we sent out to you earlier today is INCORRECT. A number of you have discovered this by making unsuccessful attempts to login to the Immunisation Portal, and we are sorry your time has been wasted.

*We are writing to inform you that the Immunisation Team is using e-consent again this year for our school-based immunisation programme.*

*Using e-consent is quicker and easier for you and can be completed on any platform including mobile phone, tablet or computer. However in the event that this is not possible, please contact us by phone (number below).*

*HPV vaccine is given in 2 doses that are 6–24 months apart. **The e-consent form you complete will cover both doses 1 and 2.** If you do not want your child to receive a vaccine, then please still go onto the form and fill in the 'NO' box.*

*Your child is due to receive the HPV vaccination on **Monday 28 September 2020.***

*Please complete the e-consent form here [www.surreyimmunisations.co.uk](http://www.surreyimmunisations.co.uk)  
You will need to enter our school's unique code, URN number **SR143903***

*This should be done before **2 pm on Thursday 24 Sept 2020** (this is when the website portal will close) to allow our nurses to review and contact parents and carers if there are any concerns, prior to the session.*

*An automated email will be sent to you on completion of the e-consent form from Cinnamon Digital Applications (who host the website portal for us). If you do not receive this, please check in your junk email or contact the Immunisation Team.*
